**Practice Gap/Need and Course Description:** Engaging the clinical needs of black people and people of color and the damaging effects of internal bias is an imperative for clinicians today. The ubiquity of systemic racism and intergenerational transmission of trauma are either unrecognized or given insufficient attention in our training and literature. The purpose of this Town Hall is to develop an increased awareness of the clinician's unconscious bias and its effects on the quality, availability and accessibility of patient care for black, indigenous, and People of Color (BIPOC) in our community. Identify how unconscious bias can disrupt and derail effective psychotherapy in cross-cultural clinical consultation.

1. Discuss the effects of intergenerational transmission of racial trauma
2. Discuss the impact and effects of racism on clinical care, including theories of psychopathology, assessment and diagnosis and implications for treatment.
3. Discuss the manifestations and effects of racial bias in our professional community and the general community.
